<u>Antifederalists</u>

*Wanted weak central government

*Were not happy with the Constitution

*George Mason, Patrick Henry, Samuel Adams, John Hancock

*Feared the Constitution would reduce the power of the states

*Feared president would be like a king

*Feared the government would pass laws that were only fair to part of the country

*Feared the Constitution did not protect basic rights of the citizens
